

The film "The hate u give" is a crime film from George Tillman Jr . It was filmed in Toronto and came into the cinema on the 5th October 2018.

The film is about a girl named Starr with a dark skin colour. She is at a party and meets an old friend there. They both grew up together. They both are just talking, then you can hear a gunshot and everyone runs away. Starr runs with her old friend named Khalil to his car, because he wants to know that she is safe home. Meanwhile, there are more often protests against corrupted cops. Later in the movie, her half brother and Starr herself are at a protest. She climbs on the top of a car and speaks up. The cops stop them aggressively and throw a thing like a gas patrone into the crowd of people. Everyone runs away. With help from two very nice people, Starr and her brother come into the shop of her dad. After the people leave, one of King`s men burns the shop so that Starr and her brother can't leave it. They want to leave at the back door but it is close. The neighbours see the fire and run outside to help the kids out. Then everything escalates and people put their guns at each other [...]
